HIGHLIGHT: The Power of One Book

This image above captured two children deeply immersed in a book. In a community often marked by chaos and brokenness, that one book opened a doorway—a world of imagination, hope, and learning.

At GOA, especially through the Children's Ministry (Yummy Book Club, Book Station, the NET Program, and Missions Academy) we're witnessing the rise of a new generation of lifelong learners and disciples.

- 20 children currently attend Missions Academy, which began March 19th and runs weekly (Wednesdays-Fridays).
- 9 children in our **NET Program** (launched April 23rd) are being equipped with foundational English, reading, and writing skills in a safe and nurturing learning space.
- Children are now reading stories aloud from the books they borrow—they inspire us to keep going.
- Over 99 children are reached each week through our various children's programs. It's not about numbers—but about nurturing deep, foundational steps that spark transformation.

This is the heartbeat of our mission: planting seeds of hope, literacy, and discipleship in young

PITCH: One Student at a Time - Education Sponsorship



We are grateful for the seven young leaders who've completed our education program and are now serving in different roles—a teacher, a chef, a customer care specialist, a personal learning assistant, two social workers with us, and an artist. These are not just success stories—they are stories of transformation.

Now, I desire to see six more students, already serving within our ministries, step into university this August. The programs they are pursuing are strategic:

- Early Childhood Education to continue raising godly, competent educators for our children's ministries
- Law to equip advocates who will speak for justice and truth in our communities
- Business Administration to nurture entrepreneurs and administrators who will create impact and integrity in the marketplace.

Each student needs **\$600 per semester** for a 3-year course (with exceptions like Law and Medicine that extend to 4+ years).



CHALLENGE: Ministry, Like Life, Is Messy — But Grace Leads Vs

One of the students we've walked with closely a young woman transitioning from her Senior Six studies has recently encountered a significant personal challenge.

Situations like these remind us that ministry involves walking with the whole person: their hopes, their hurts, and the complexities of real life.

We're not here to judge, but to love. And so, we are walking with her in grace offering counsel, emotional support, and prayer. This is what grace does: it steps into the mess, and stays.

Ministry is never neat it's relational, vulnerable, and redemptive. And yet, this is what we're called to: walking forward in love, truth, and hope.
